Re: **Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessment  
Sandringham Solar Farm FIT-FM1T51L  
P027-106-2010**

You have enquired as to whether the approximately northeast corner of the property that was subject to archaeological assessment in 2010 had been completed. The assessment was done and completed and conducted under the 1993 Technical Standards (since replaced in 2011) of the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport.

The TS is proposed to be placed in a new area than originally planned, now in the northeasterly corner of the property. This area, at the time of archaeological assessment, was a small permanently wet area and some surrounding shallow pasture. The shallow pasture (overlying bedrock) was test pitted in 5 metre intervals. The wet area, as per the guidelines, did not require any further archaeological assessment.

There were no archaeological sites located in the northeastern corner of the study area, and there are no further archaeological concerns, other than the standard compliance legislation (that is, if something is uncovered during construction/development, development activity must cease, and a licensed archaeologist must evaluate next steps).
